Alta Williams, was born Alta Jean Thornton on June 24, 1936 to parents Harry and Lucille Thornton, who resided in Harlem, New York. Alta is survived by daughter, Tamre Clark and son, Kedar Thornton; two grandchildren, Brittany and Justin; three great-grandchildren, Aubrey, Josiah, and Kori; a brother, Clifford Thornton; three nephews, William "Billy," Anthony, and Nkosi; a niece, Afiya; a sister in law, Renee; and countless friends and admirers. A special lady indeed, Alta was a devoted daughter, caring for her parents as they aged, dedicated mother to her children Tamre and Kedar, loving companion to her Julius Burton, aka Jim Dandy, good counsel to her siblings, caretaker for her sisters during their most vulnerable and dire times of need, and doting grandmother and aunty. A fashionista, Alta was always well dressed and embraced life fully. She loved 1960s R&B and bright colors, with yellow being her favorite color, she even had a yellow car. In her earlier years, Alta hosted numerous parties for family and friends. She surrounded herself with beauty in her home and in inspirational quotes she displayed on the wall of her bedroom. An entrepreneur, Alta started "Sunny Inspirations", a floral arrangement and interior decorating business, and "Alta's Personal Secretarial Services." Alta had many hobbies. Before her health began to fail, she generously volunteered time to local and presidential elections. Although Alta was not known for her cooking, she was proud of her mastery of

lasagna which she was eager to share with family and friends, especially during holiday get-togethers. The world is a duller place without Alta Williams, but we were blessed to have been touched by her beauty, love, kindness, and wisdom. We will miss her spirit of goodness.
