Alfred "Al" Schulz of Teaneck, NJ passed away in his home on August 31, 2022, surrounded by family, at the age of 84. He was preceded in death by his wife, Noel, of 41 years and his parents Alfred and Louise. He is survived by his daughter, Alicia McKillop, (spouse Patrick), and granddaughters, Colleen, Elise and Rylie; his daughter, Stacie Cataldo, (spouse Joseph), and grandchildren, Michael, Gianna and Alexa. Al was a loving stepfather and grandfather to Lorrie Reeves, her son, Daniel; Judy Cook (spouse Craig), their children Alyssa and Derek, Richard Reeves (spouse Susan), their children Megan, Richard, Jessica and Conor; Donna Fighera; several great-grandchildren; as well as many extended family members and friends.

Al was born in the Bronx, and then a lifetime resident of Teaneck, NJ. He was a graduate of Teaneck High School and became a Teaneck Police Officer/Detective #140, on August 1, 1962. He retired on Sept. 1, 1987, after 25 years of service. He then worked for the Teaneck Public Schools for 28 years as a truancy officer. He received many accolades for his service and dedication throughout both careers. Al was inducted into the Teaneck Athletic Hall of Fame in 2015.

His whole life Al was very active in the community and a huge supporter of all Teaneck sports. He was a diehard NY Giants fan and season ticketholder for 60+ years. He enjoyed playing golf and socializing with friends and family. He

adored his grandchildren, his face lit up whenever they were around.

Al is part of many people's happy memories. We've heard that he was "the most popular guy in town", the "unofficial Mayor of Teaneck", a true Teaneck "Icon" and "Legend". Someone else said that Al WAS Teaneck. He will be dearly missed.
