Alice Mary Berdan, 80, a lifelong resident of Teaneck, passed away unexpectedly on Saturday, January 4, 2024. Alice was a graduate of Benedictine Academy in Paterson and went on to receive her Bachelor's Degree in History from Manhattanville College. She worked as a financial analyst for J & W Seligman, a prominent brokerage and advisory firm, for 38 years.
