Diane Conroy (née McLaughlin), a woman defined by her kindness, passed away peacefully at home surrounded by her loving family on Sunday, February 15, 2026.

Born on June 11, 1943, in Jamaica, Queens, to the late Stasia and Bernard McLaughlin, Diane was raised in Richmond Hill, Queens, alongside her brothers, Jim and Bruce. After graduating from Bishop McDonnell Memorial High School, she followed her calling into healthcare, earning her nursing degree from the Queens Hospital Center School of Nursing. It was during these formative years that she met and fell in love with the late Bernard (Barney) Conroy.

Diane and Barney married in 1965, beginning their life together in Woodhaven, Queens, before eventually settling in River Edge, New Jersey. For nearly sixty years, Diane was a dedicated resident of River Edge and a faithful parishioner of St. Peter the Apostle. 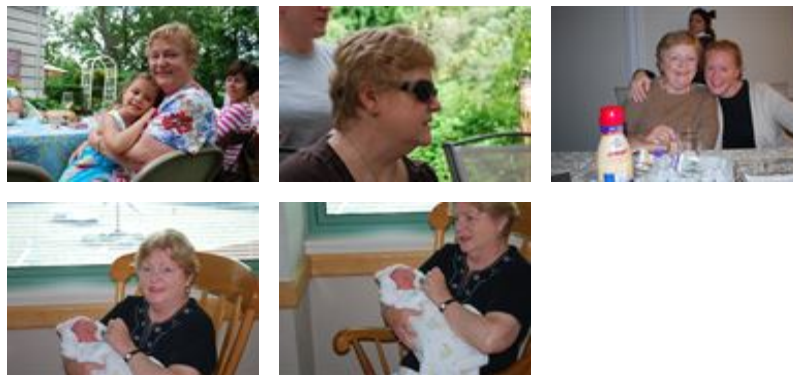
