George F. Kolze (1950–2026)

George F. Kolze, of Lake Luzerne, NY, passed away on February 5, 2026. Born on December 24, 1950, and raised in Oradell, NJ, George was a graduate of Bergen Catholic High School and continued his education at Marquette University.

In 1972, George began a distinguished career as a Police Officer in River Edge, NJ, where he served the community for 28 years. Following his retirement from the force in 2000, he moved to Lake George, where he owned and operated the Balsam Motel for 17 years—a role he truly loved.

George was deeply involved in youth sports, serving as the President of the Little League in the late 1980s and spending many years coaching his children's teams in both Little League and REGAL. To his community, George was a dedicated officer and business owner, but to his family, he was quite simply our hero. He led with a quiet strength and an unwavering devotion that served as the foundation for our lives.

He is survived by his beloved wife, Suzanne; his son Daniel, daughter Marissa and her husband, Joseph; and his sons, Michael and his wife Heather, and David and his wife Kristin. He was the adoring grandfather to Grayson and his "Princess," McKenna. He is also survived by his brother, Neal Kolze, and his wife Ingrid.
