“ So sorry to hear about Jerry. Sad, but still a celebration of Jerry getting to finally “Ride the chariot to see his Lord” (one of the earliest Christian Chorister songs with Jerry singing the solo lines).

*Many knew Jerry and his great first tenor voice and possibly even greater sense of humor. Things were never dull when Jerry was around. I had the blessing of being able to be a part of the Choristers for 27 of Jerry’s 40 years in the group.*

*Saturday afternoon rehearsals with Jerry singing “Ride the Chariot” always were great times. You know that back then, Jerry was a confirmed bachelor. When he sang the line, “Are you ready, my Sister? ... Oh, Yes!” there was always some great Chorister “heckling” ... good-natured comments ... especially, I believe, from Brother Bill Hrubik.*

*At one Chorister weekend (or maybe during our 1967 western tour), someone from the host church who didn’t know that Jerry wasn’t married asked, “Is your wife here?” Jerry’s response: “Possibly”. That joke never got old.*

*Several times when the Chorister weekend was in Columbus or Mansfield, Jerry would fly to Columbus on Friday night and stay overnight with us. Nancy always had dinner ready when we arrived from the airport. Those weekends often fell in October (or cooler weather months). The first time Jerry stayed with us, Nancy served potato soup. You know, the thick, steaming, hearty kind with chunks of sausage ... perfect for a cool autumn evening. Two years later, Jerry was back on a similar Friday night and, without thought about the menu two years prior, Nancy served ... thick potato soup, of course, with big chunks of sausage. For the rest of our years with Jerry, whenever and wherever we would see him, he would always ask Nancy, “What’s for dinner? Potato soup?” With Jerry, that one also never got old.*

*From 1964 through 1990, whenever the Choristers were in Union*

*City (NJ) or Woodcliffe Lake, I would always stay with Jerry and his mom. Each time, I would get detailed updates from Mom Dobos about her most recent garage sale bargains, purchases and sales. She had an on-going sale which was not a yard sale like here in the Midwest, but truly a “garage” sale. Their garage was her show-room, with every wall stacked with shelves full of knick-knacks, tea cups, and all variety of treasures. She knew what she had paid for each item (hundreds of them), and what the minimum price would be for the re-sale ... quite a sales-person. Animated and always entertaining. (Joyful memories.) I also had the privilege of knowing Jerry’s dad back in the 1960’s ... Jerry was truly a “chip off the old block”.*

*And in addition to Jerry’s gifted voice and contagious humor, Jerry had a rock-solid faith in his Lord Jesus, and a life-long dedication of commitment to the Apostolic Christian Church and the ministry of the Christian Choristers. I am truly blessed from knowing him and being able to call him my brother.*

*I wish I could be present at the home-going memorials for all of our Chorister brothers when they graduate to their heavenly reward. I appreciate so much the wonderful turn-out of so many current and past Choristers for my brother Dave’s memorial service two years ago. Distance and schedule prevent me from paying my respects in person this time. I hope this note brings a warm smile to all who read it as we remember and bid a temporary farewell to one of our own, but anticipate the day when we shall “walk (together) with Him in white”.*
