Gerard X. Quinn died suddenly on Sunday, December 23, 2012 at the age of 98. Gerard was born in Hoboken, NJ, to the late Thomas and Anne Lardner Quinn. He graduated from St. Michael's H.S in Union City, N.J. and St. Peter's College in Jersey City, NJ. He later moved to Washington, D.C. where he enlisted in the Air Force at the outbreak of WWII.
