Buzz was a gifted “Mr. Fix-It” – could figure out anything mechanical in the house, a car or boat. Family members and neighbors often called upon his experience when they needed help, and he never hesitated to assist. Buzz was a proud member of the Ridgefield NJ GOP and cared about the community, pitching in as a coach, civic leader and supportive neighbor. He also lived in the Lanoka Harbor NJ community and could be seen frequently walking his dogs to the beach and chatting with neighbors. He enjoyed the waters of Barnegat Bay and having fun with friends and family on the lagoon and just living the Jersey Shore life.

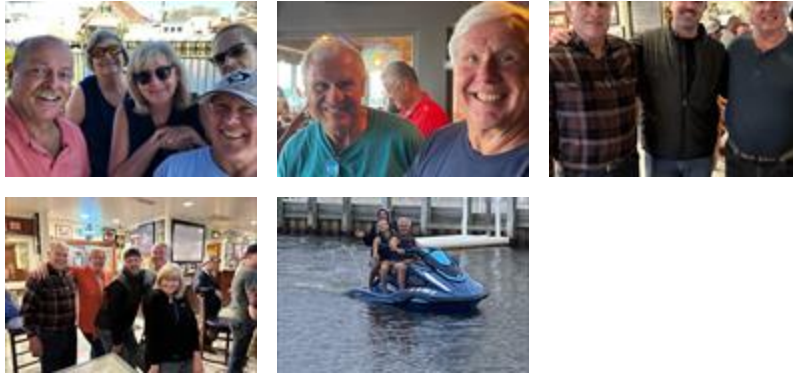
