She met the love of her life, Paul Sweeney, during WWII. After Paul was released from a POW camp in Germany he returned to England and proposed. Jean came to the United States and raised a family of eight in Teaneck, N.J. She became an active parishioner at St. Anastasia's Catholic Church where she served as an extraordinary minister, feeding the homeless with the Bowery ministry, and working in the the kitchen hosting the monthly senior lunches. Jean was also a Girl Scout leader, PTA president, and she served on various community boards.
