BASH, PhD., Julian G., 91, of Englewood, NJ, passed away on Monday, June 30, 2014.

Beloved husband of the late Professor Adelaide Bash (nee Brown). Devoted father of Verna Bash-Flowers, Esq. and her husband Bryan. Loving grandfather to Bryan Flowers II, his fiancée Dr. Nicole Ivy, Michelle Flowers, and Jeremiah Thom.

Dr. Bash was a Social Worker for Dwight Morrow H.S. in Englewood, NJ. He was very active in local and national politics: he marched on Washington in 1963 with Dr. Martin Luther King Jr.; was influential in desegregating the school system in Englewood; was a member of the Traffic Advisory Committee for Englewood; and served on the Board of Directors for Rahway State Prison. Dr. Bash was also a volunteer driver for FISH, providing transportation for the sick.
