The Teaneck Chamber of Commerce recently honored him as 2009 Citizen of the Year. He was a past Coach and Officer of the Teaneck Southern Little League. He was involved in multiple charitable organizations including the Teaneck Rotary Club (a thirty-year member, two-time past President and past Director) and the Children's Miracle Network through RE/MAX.
