I remember when we "borrowed" the station wagon , skipped school, and went fishing on opening day of the fishing season, and then got caught by school authorities the next day. She never said a word to anyone. She really enjoyed our adventures. Often with her smile and kind of a wink. But I will never forget how she made sure one of Russ's other buddies who came from a difficult home environment spent summer vacation with the Kreys on Cape Cod. That was the kind of person she and Mr. Krey were. They were just always doing acts of loving kindness. Yes, occasionally Mrs. Krey might be "politically incorrect" in the terms she used but it was never with any malice. I don't think she knew what malice was. I know that this world needs a few million Mrs. Krey clones to make it a better place. But her legacy, among others, is the fine trio of sons she raised, all successful, honest, hard working, good husbands and fathers. I will miss you Mrs. Krey.
