Myron Rene Taylor of Teaneck, NJ passed January 20, 2014. Myron was born June 14, 1939 in Washington, D.C. to Harrison M. Taylor and Marie Louise Taylor. He was the youngest of three sons. He married his childhood sweetheart, JoAnn Pleasants on July 12, 1969. There are no children from this union. This year marked their 44th anniversary.

He attended public school in Washington. After graduation from high school he joined the U.S. Air Force and served honorably for 4 years. He returned home and attended Howard University, earning a Bachelors Degree in economics and a minor in business. He was recruited by Morgan Guaranty Trust Co. in 1968. He started in the research department. Two years later he was made an Assistant Treasurer in the Government Bond Department. In 1973 he made Assistant Vice President. He was elected Vice President in August 1974 and Senior Vice President in 1976. As Senior Vice President he was in charge of the US Government Bond Department, sales and trading. At that time he was the highest ranking man of color in the United States banking industry and handled about \$2 billion dollars per day. Following his retirement from Morgan Guaranty he was employed by Sanwa BGK, a primary dealer in US Government securities, trading treasury bills. Later he founded S.L.Y., Inc. (Solvency, Liquidity and Yield Inc.) to manage his personal financial interests. Myron was Myron 24/7 and “always said what he meant and meant what he said.” He was a devoted husband, loyal friend and generous person. He had a

strong sense of justice and an equal sense of humor. He will be long remembered for his loyalty, integrity and will be missed by all who knew him. He was an avid reader, a lover of jazz (particularly Miles Davis) and he was always well dressed.

On Monday, January 20th, 2014, Myron Rene departed in Teaneck, NJ. Beloved husband of JoAnn L. Taylor and devoted brother of Reynold Taylor. He is also survived by several nieces and nephews. Myron Rene was predeceased by his parents, Harrison M. Taylor and Marie Louise Taylor, and brother Donald Taylor.

Memorial Service will be held at Volk Leber Funeral Home, 789 Teaneck Road, Teaneck, NJ on May 23, 2014 at 12:00 P.M. Expressions of sympathy may be made to "Doctors Without Borders".

“ Remembrances of a True Friend

I've known Myron since 1967 [or was it 1968?] when he appeared one day on the MGT Treasury trading floor as a new management trainee where he shared a small desk with Tim Collins' snake plant and some bond reference books - they were tight for space at the time - but he was lucky - my desk didn't even have a plant!

Since day one, he became mutual friends with Aspasia and Cengiz Israfil when we all worked together on MGT's trading floor. They too have remained our life-long friends.

I recall that Myron was the sharpest dresser on the floor - he loved double-breasted suits and later on, when he became Head of the Government Bond Department, his private office was the MGT 'fitting room' for 'Frank Zee's Hong Kong Tailor' visits.

He was a jazz lover and introduced me to the music of Miles Davis - I remember hearing 'Bitches Brew' for the first time at Myron & Jo Ann's apartment overlooking Central Park one summer evening and becoming hooked on Miles' music ever since. I'm listening to 'Pharaoh's Dance' as I write this - thank you, Myron!

When Myron & Jo Ann moved from their apartment in Manhattan to their new house in Teaneck, NJ, we all helped - I was the 'designated driver' for the rental truck since we needed the biggest one available and it only came with a stick shift! We actually did the deed without scratching or breaking too much furniture, as I recall.

After my wife and I moved in the early 1980's from Manhattan to Princeton, NJ and Myron was working for himself, he had more free time to visit — we would combine music listening sessions with computer hardware/software overhauls. (Thank goodness for portables - I remember him hauling desktop computers, monitors and printers out of his car and up the steps in the early days of personal computers.) My son Zach would always look forward to a

'boys day out' with Myron whenever he visited.

When Myron & Joann would visit for dinner or a BBQ, Myron would have to demonstrate the finer points of backyard badminton to Zach & Alexandra. Myron even learned how to ride a tandem bicycle on one of these occasions!

Myron was always extraordinarily generous of his time - one of many examples: he offered to drive Zach and I to Pittsburgh [before my first hip replacement] when Zach attended a pre-college summer course.

In short, Myron was the kind of rare, true friend with whom you could spend an entire day enjoying common interests — politics, humor, music, a drive along the Delaware River, a bench by Rosedale Lake and of course the many memorable evenings at Myron's favorite Manhattan restaurant, Chef Ho's — without saying many words but communicating in spirit just the same.

His loss is profoundly felt by our family and we express our heartfelt condolences to Jo Ann and his entire family. He will be sorely missed!
