Nathaniel Solomon, 79, a lifelong resident of the Bronx, died Monday, January 22, 2024. Beloved and much-missed father of Dan Solomon and his wife Mira Solomon, loving grandfather of Emma Solomon, and brother to Henry Solomon; he was predeceased by his wife Linda Diane Solomon.

Nat had a long career as an ESL teacher and administrator in the New York City school system, where he helped students to learn a new language and culture. In his retirement, Nat enjoyed spending time on Lake St. Catherine in Vermont, meeting friends at the JASA Van Cortlandt Senior Center, and visiting his family. He was a skilled photographer who in later years took stunning photographs of nature and the skies outside his apartment overlooking the Jerome Park Reservoir. Nat also enjoyed searching for a good deal and perusing tag sales looking for unique and interesting finds. And as his friends know, he had a great sense of humor and deep love of puns.
