Paul C. Haines, 77, of Englewood, NJ, died peacefully on Saturday, December 10, 2016, at Englewood hospital.

Paul was born March 24, 1939 at Gotham Hospital in New York City to Arland and Sophie (Applebome) Haines. After graduating from Tenafly High School, Paul attended Colgate University where he earned a degree in psychology.

Paul then went on to serve his country as a pilot, lieutenant JG, in the United States Navy. He was honorably discharged in 1962.

Paul started his retail and merchandising career as a buyer with JC Penney, moving onto S&H Green Stamps and then onto Consumers Distributing as VP of Regional Operations and ending his long career as owner of Dynasty Fashion Jewelry, an importing and wholesaling business. After retiring in 2001, Paul used his love and knowledge of hunting and fishing by working part time at Ramsey Outdoor Store.
