It is with deep sadness and heavy hearts that we announce the passing of Robert Paul DuBay, known lovingly to his friends and family as “Dubes.” Robert was born on June 3, 1952, in Weehawken, NJ, and tragically passed away on November 24, 2025, in a sudden accident at his home on 35 Walnut Street in Teaneck, NJ.

Robert was the beloved son of Theodore and Pauline (Picollo) DuBay, who moved to Teaneck in the 1960s, where they raised Robert and his sister Janet. It was here that Robert spent most of his life, forming lifelong friendships and becoming an integral part of the community.

He is survived by his devoted sister, Janet DuBay Munczinski and her husband, William; numerous nieces and nephews; and his longtime girlfriend, Suzanne Clark, whose companionship brought him much joy.
